Dear Colleague:

You are invited to the **Concertmaster Auditions** of the *Louisiana Philharmonic Orchestra*. The Concertmaster is a one-year position that could become a permanent, tenure track position. Employment is to begin immediately or at the earliest time mutually agreed upon by the winning candidates and the LPO. If a current member of the LPO violin section is awarded the position, another section position may be offered to a finalist. The auditions will take place in New Orleans on **September 16, 2013** at the First Baptist Church of New Orleans, 5290 Canal Blvd., New Orleans 70124.

The auditions are scheduled to begin at 10:00AM. Unless otherwise notified, please report at 9:00AM. Depending upon the number of candidates, we may stagger times of arrival at the audition site. These times will be given to you two to three weeks before the audition; otherwise your personal audition time will be assigned as you arrive. The LPO does not screen candidates. All who apply are welcome to audition.

The Louisiana Philharmonic is a full time orchestra with the 2012-13 season consisting of thirty-six weeks. A full schedule of 17 subscription concerts, 4 operas and several ballet performances are planned as well as light classic's, children's concerts and a Pops series.

Salary for the position of Concertmaster will be determined at the time of hire. Paid instrument insurance, major medical group health insurance, life insurance, disability insurance and the AFM union pension plan are provided.

Although the bulk of the audition repertoire is included in the repertoire list, please be aware that standard orchestral repertoire <u>may</u> be requested during any phase of the auditions.

In order for us to more accurately plan our audition schedule, it is necessary for us to require a refundable \$50.00 audition reservation deposit. Your check will be returned to you when you arrive at the audition or will be returned to you if you cancel one week before the date of your audition. Please take a moment to fill out the "Applicant Information" form and return it, along with your deposit, and a one page resume, as soon as you can. Deadline to receive materials for this audition will be one week before the posted date.

- 1. First movement from a standard 19th or 20th century violin concerto with cadenza.
- 2. Your choice of one of the following: Mozart Concerto #3, OR #4, OR #5 (first movement only) with cadenza.

Schumann Symphony #2 Scherzo, first page only (with repeat)

Strauss Don Juan First page only

Most listed excerpts are public domain and unrestricted by any copyright laws. Candidates will be responsible for obtaining practice parts.

If you have difficulty obtaining parts, you may be able to acquire them at the *Petrucci Music Library of Public Domain Materials*. Also known as IMSLP.

On the left side of the web page, look for search box just below the donate button. Enter the composer's last name and the piece you are looking for (e.g. Brahms Symphony #1). The subcategory of the piece you are looking for should be at the top of the search results. Click on that result and it will take you to the page with pdfs of scores and parts for the piece.

At the top of the page is a table of contents. Click on "parts," and you will be taken to that section of the web page. Select the instrument you are looking for (e.g. Trombone 2) and download the file. (The first time in any session that you start to download something, you will have to acknowledge a disclaimer). Then continue with downloading the file you want. Please consider making a donation to the IMSLP - Petrucci Music Library if you download music from it.

You may use your own parts at the audition or those provided on stage by the LPO.

Additional standard orchestral repertoire may be requested at any time.
